### **WNMU W.I.L.L. COURSE OFFERS RETIREES A NEW LIFE**

SILVER CITY, N.M. – When most people retire they probably think of all that extra time they will have. Bill Charland, Western New Mexico University professor, thinks otherwise. He will facilitate the new Western Institute of Lifelong Learning (WILL) course “Renewing Work in Retirement.”

For each Saturday in June course registrants can explore what kind of paid or volunteer work life has for them during retirement. Charland has authored half a dozen books on the subject including “Life Work: A Career Guide for Idealists” available in the WNMU Bookstore. Director of the Honors Program at WNMU, Charland is a career counselor and educator who has assisted hundred of people in career-related issues.

Located at Hunter Hall’s top floor, the class will include four two-hour sessions, from 10:00am to 12:00pm on June 7, 14, 21 and 28. Registration is now available by calling 538-6835.

WILL courses are ongoing and designed for those 50 years or older. Other summer classes include Introduction to Weaving and Chess for Beginners and Intermediates. Only members can enroll in courses. One year of unlimited courses is available for a one-time \$50 fee.
