Western New Mexico University, a public, comprehensive, regional institution serving a diverse multicultural population of 3,000 students. WNMU's nationally accredited programs include nursing, occupational therapy, education, business, social work, and the child development center. WNMU offers a variety of two-year programs, four-year programs and master's level degree programs. This position is located at WNMU's Gallup Graduate Studies Center (GGSC). Gallup is a small, culturally diverse, rural community approximately 5 hours from the Silver campus. The GGSC serves approximately 200 graduate students a year. Exemplary teaching, quality programs, commitment to diversity, and enhanced regional service characterize WNMU's mission. Western New Mexico University is committed to outcomes assessment. All faculty and students are part of an ongoing effort to determine and refine the effectiveness of instruction and learning.

Applications are invited for the following anticipated opening: a nine-month, visiting faculty position to start in **January 2012**. The successful candidate is required to be involved in teaching, advising, university committees, program assessment, university and community service, and scholarly activity. All finalists will be expected to make a thirty-minute (30) presentation in an actual classroom situation at the time of the interview. The topic will be the choice of the screening committee. Previous teaching experience in higher education and past successful school psychology and/or counseling experience with groups from diverse backgrounds are required.

Western New Mexico University-Gallup – Seeks an Assistant Professor of Counseling and School Psychology, 9 month, tenure-track position. **Minimum Qualifications:** Should hold an earned doctorate in Counseling, School Psychology, or related discipline (ABD candidates will be considered). Must be a licensed professional in New Mexico (counselor or psychologist) or eligible for NM license or NCC certification. Three (3) to five (5) years experience teaching counseling at the University level and three (3) to five (5) counseling or school psychology experience. Experience providing clinical supervision and working with diverse populations in rural settings is required. **Preferred Qualifications:** Have experience working with diverse, Native American, and Hispanic populations. Interest in or experience teaching web-based courses and a Level II School Psychologist license. **The successful candidate assumes the following responsibilities:** Teach 9 graduate credit hour course load per semester in Masters of Arts in Counseling program with focus on School Psychology cross-listed content. Courses are at night and/or weekends. Manage application and placement process for graduate MA Counseling majors and /or School Psychology licensure candidates in pre-practicum and counseling internship field placements. Prepare candidates for state and national licensure examinations and/or certification and requirements. Supervise and coordinate field experiences of counseling and/or school psychology licensure students or majors; assist counseling majors, cooperating field mentors, and faculty (adjunct) before and during pre-practicum, practicum, and internships, including evaluation of exit portfolio, in which candidates demonstrate that they have met program and licensure competencies. Advise counseling graduate majors and school psych licensure students; advisement hours include late afternoons. Manage collection and analysis of electronic candidate evaluation information as part of program assessment (NCATE, EARS, CACREP, SLO, and other accreditation and regulatory reports). Contribute to ongoing university effort to determine and refine the effectiveness of instruction and learning. Conduct research agenda of choice in counseling and/or school psychology. Liaison with community agency and mental health partners to identify, facilitate, and provide practicum and internship experiences and further develops field placement sites. Work closely with P-12 school counselors, school psychologists, and other partners. Serve on and participate in university committees and participate in assessment, recruitment, and retention efforts. Demonstrate the integration of computerized multimedia instructional methods and videotaping of practice counseling sessions in appropriate courses. Possess knowledge of NASP competencies and best practices. Be willing to develop online/web based courses as appropriate to content. **SALARY RANGE: \$54,614 - \$59,566**
