Applications are invited for the following anticipated opening: a nine -month, tenure track faculty position to start in **January 2012**. The successful candidate is required to be involved in teaching, advising, university committees, program assessment, university and community service, and scholarly activity. All finalists will be expected to make a thirty-minute (30) presentation in an actual classroom situation at the time of the interview. The topic will be specific to School Counseling. Previous teaching experience in higher education and past successful school psychology and/or counseling experience with groups from diverse backgrounds are required.

**WNMU- Silver City – Seeks an Assistant Professor of School Counseling**, 9 month, tenure-track position. **Minimum Qualifications:** Should hold an earned doctorate in counseling or related discipline. ABD candidates will be considered. Must be a licensed School Counselor professional in New Mexico or eligible for NM license. Three (3) to five (5) years experience teaching counseling at University level and three (3) to five (5) years school counseling experience. Experience providing clinical supervision and working with diverse populations in rural settings is required. **Preferred Qualifications:** Experience teaching web-based courses preferred. **The successful candidate assumes the following responsibilities:** Teach 9 graduate credit hour course load per semester in Masters of Arts in Counseling program. Courses are at night and/or weekends. Manage application and placement process for graduate MA Counseling majors and/or licensure candidates in pre-practicum, practicum, and counseling internship field placement. Prepare candidates for state and national license examinations and/or certification and requirements. Supervise and coordinate field experiences of counseling majors; assist counseling majors, cooperating field mentors, and faculty (adjunct) before and during pre-practicum, practicum, and internships, including evaluation of exit portfolio, in which candidates demonstrate that they have met program and licensure competencies. Advise counseling graduate majors; advisement hours include late afternoons. Manage collection and analysis of electronic candidate evaluation information as part of program assessment (NCATE, EARS, CACREP, SLO, and other accreditation and regulatory reports). Contribute to ongoing university effort to determine and refine the effectiveness of instruction and learning. Conduct research agenda of choice in counseling. Liaison with community partners to identify, facilitate, and provide practicum and internship experiences and further develop field placement sites. Serve on and participate in university committees and participate in assessment, recruitment, and retention efforts. Demonstrate the integration of computerized multimedia instructional methods and videotaping of practice counseling sessions in appropriate courses. Be willing to develop online/web based courses as appropriate to content. **Salary Range: \$54,614 - \$59,566**
